



OVERDRIVE WEBSITE UPDATED!

For our patrons who have been using the Overdrive app or website to download free e-books and magazines...a couple of changes to take note of.

On the plus side, the Overdrive website is being upgraded and will go into effect on November 2nd. There's nothing you need to do, however, don't be surprised when it looks a little different when you log in. You'll still have your account with your library card but you'll want to try out the 'new' navigation and become familiar with it.

On the 'sad' side—Barnes & Noble has discontinued their partnership with Overdrive so the magazine collection available via the Nook app will no longer be available. Overdrive will hopefully be creating its own magazine section in the near future. For now, we recommend you give Zinio (a different service) a try for magazines!

27th Annual Shaler Holiday "Lite" Up Night


Saturday, November 19, 7:00pm
