
Woodstock: Three Days that Defined a Generation by PBS, The American Experience (REG) Thursday, August 8 at 2:00pm






Community News

Congratulations to Shaler resident George Kruth on the publication of his book, *Shalercrest: A Defense Housing Project*. This 349-page book is a history of how the federal government provided housing to World War II defense workers in a specific community in the Shaler Township suburban community. After the war, these projects were sold by the government to individual residents as a co-operative organization with individual ownership by the residents of the project.
