

## How can I access these resources?

**Note:** Most of these sites can ONLY be accessed through a library computer with your library card.



## Ancestry



One of the most well-known virtual genealogy resource, Ancestry is available from any library computer or your own device when connected to the library wi-fi.

Here is a list of what you may find on Ancestry to help with your research:

- ◇ Pennsylvania Birth Records in Ancestry at this time cover 1906-1913
- ◇ Pennsylvania Death Records from 1906-1968
- ◇ Census records cover 1790-1950

\*Most of the 1890 census has not survived, but some secondary lists did

### Some tips to get you started:

1. Try to include at least one location whenever you search, whether it's a birthplace of somewhere the person may have lived. Even an educated guess will help the search engine narrow down possible matches.
2. Same goes for birth year– add one if you have it, or make a good guess.
3. Use the Card Catalog to find collections you want to search. Enter a state, county or city name in the Keyword field to find local histories or other local collections.

# Family Search



**Note:** While this site is free to use, you will need to create a free account to access many of their features.

A great resource for local records including Allegheny county :

- ◇ Marriage Dockets
- ◇ Birth and Death Records
- ◇ Deeds

**TIP:** Many of these local records are not indexed, meaning they will not show up in a general search. Instead, use the Catalog under the Search menu, then search by place to see the list of Allegheny

FamilySearch is also a great source for European records . New records are added every week, so it's worth checking back periodically, and searching the catalog, even if you don't find the right record today.

**Note:** This resource is available through POWER LIBRARY and can be accessed through your home computer with your library card.



This multilingual family history research database includes billions of historical documents from 48 countries, millions of historical photos, public records, indexes, and additional resources that span the past five centuries.

## Content Includes:

- ◇ The U.S. federal census (1790-1950) with images
- ◇ The U.K. census (1790-1950) with images
- ◇ Citizenship and naturalization records
- ◇ Wills and probate records
- ◇ More than 100 million records added every month!
